We experience that same amazing grace of God in confession and forgiveness this Lent as we look toward the cross of Christ that made our freedom from sin possible.

**MONDAYS-IN-LENT RETURN:** Have you missed the Monday mid-day ecumenical worship and a meal? In 2020, Holy Cross hosted the one and only service and meal before the pandemic put a stop to everything. Please put it on your radar for Mondays in Lent beginning February 27 at noon. The schedule will be out in coming bulletins and the March newsletter.



**In Search of Paul** – I am super excited after the first Zoom meeting last night with a group of people who are taking a journey called "In Search of Paul 2023". Before the journey begins, leaving the Tuesday after Easter, the group is reading three books to get understand more deeply the life and ministry of Paul and the world in which he preached, which was overshadowed by the Roman Empire.

We will begin and end our journey in the ancient region of Thrace or what is now Istanbul, Turkey, and then make a route along the Roman roads of what is now Greece, some of which Paul would have traveled. We will visit some of the cities he visited: Philippi, Thessaloniki, Athens and Corinth, before heading back to Turkey and the cities of Ephesus, Assos and Troas.

Some of the questions we will consider both as we prepare and along the way are: How did Paul understand justice, righteousness, salvation, faith, law, and gospel as he wrote to diverse urban people living in a society dominated by patronage and Roman Imperial Theology? What does his 1st century gospel mean in a 21st century context?

The first Zoom gathering was a conversation on the first book we read, *The First Paul: Reclaiming the Radical Visionary Behind the Church's Conservative Icon*, by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan. It is undisputed by scholars that the "first" Paul wrote seven letters to early Christian churches in this order: 1 Thessalonians, Galatians, 1 Corinthians, Philemon, Philippians, 2 Corinthians and Romans. Other letters attributed to Paul, most like were written by others in Paul's name to address specific issues with Christian congregations: Colossians, Ephesians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 and 2 Timothy and Titus.



Beginning to take a closer look at the life of Paul, we discussed what may have been the "thorn in his flesh" (possibly malaria based on the area in which he lived), and the Roman Empire. What would it be like to live in a world where the rulers, the Caesars, were considered gods and "sons of god", and hear Paul's message of the gospel of Jesus Christ. For example, engraved upon this Roman coin used in the time of Christ, it is written, Caesar Augustus, son of a god (the Divine Julius Caesar), father of the country.

I hope to share more in the coming months, both before and after this journey!


