CROSSROADS

I wonder, how has the "Go and..." themes impacted your lives? In July, "Go and...share your story", really led to some great conversation in our Adult Education class – even a little humor as we watched stand-up comedian Jim Gaffigan's life in 90 seconds. Ever thought of putting your life in a 90-second video? For Gaffigan, it is a promo for his new comedy special; yet he includes difficult, life-changing events such as the death of his mother at 52 and the Pandemic. For some in class, sharing our story includes seeing God at work in times of struggle. We recalled the words of Jesus to the disciples in the midst of a raging storm on the Sea of Galilee, ""Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

This month, as we prepare for our "God's Work. Our Hands" day of service, the theme is very aptly: Go and...serve with neighbors. "Serving" is one of the Holy Cross Congregation's key values. I often hear stories of how people at Holy Cross are serving in their vocations and through volunteering as they use their gifts for the world: mentoring and supporting students, sharing their gift of music, helping neighbors in so many ways, serving with groups and organizations throughout the community and in countless ways within the Holy Cross congregation.

Go and...serve with neighbors. Teresa of Avila, a Carmelite nun living in the 1500's wrote this beautiful poem, *Christ Has No Body*. The words live on centuries later with a powerful reminder for us.

Assisting Ministers: What, Why, How? (Training: Sunday, Sept. 24, 10:15 a.m.) Holy Cross is seeking to reignite the ministry of "assisting minister" which was once a vibrant part of Sunday ministry at Holy Cross, but was put on hold during pandemic. And so we will share with the congregation here what this role is, why it exists and how

one does it. When we know this together as a community, we can share the responsibility for raising up leaders for this role and support those who assist in this way in worship.

The assisting minister role has deep roots in Christian history. The early church commissioned deacons to take extra food from the offering at holy communion to those in need. In this role they came to serve as assisting ministers in worship: praying for the needs of the world, giving thanks for the offering, assisting the presiding minister at the table, serving the people bread or wine, and sending the people forth to love and serve their neighbor.

The assisting minister role requires an understanding of all parts of worship and how they work together. This ancient role has its own dignity and importance within worship and, along with the presiding minister, offers continuity of leadership throughout the worship service.

We hope this brief description of the assisting minister will encourage you to suggest people who might be good candidates for this important position – maybe yourself! We invite you to consider attending the training scheduled on Sunday, September 24, at 10:15 a.m. following worship to learn more.

The training will provide an opportunity for further discernment and those attending the training can decide to continue or not after training is completed.


