We have a great group of six confirmation students this year, and you are invited to join them for coffee, lemonade, cookies and conversation on All Saints Day. It works out perfectly this year for you Saints of Holy Cross to join them and share your story. And also to be open to learning from them – I know that I learn from these young people every time we meet. I also enjoy remembering the days of youth as we share highs and lows at the start of our time together. Highs of accomplishments, activities, time with friends. Lows of loss and stress.

How can you be involved with our Confirmation Youth?

- 1. Sign up to join us for a class period or to be a prayer partner. (Sign up in the narthex)
- 2. Join us for the All Saints Coffee and Conversation on November 1.
- 3. Give them a shout-out when you see them in worship!

Times together with different generations is such a gift. As we have many elders in our congregation, this quote seems especially fitting: "There is no more noble way to spend these (later) years than to become an elder, to bear witness to the world as placeholders for peace, love, wisdom and fearlessness." Kathleen Dowling Singh from her book The Grace in Aging: Awaken as You Grow Older For Singh, when we choose to ripen, to awaken as we age, we offer a gift to the world and future generations.

#### 2. CALLING ALL DRIVERS AND SOON-TO-BE- DRIVERS!

Another opportunity for all, but especially new and soon-to-be drivers, is on Thankoffering Sunday, November 12, following worship. Casey Holsing will speak about "The Power of Prayer and Distracted Driving." Casey's mission in life is to talk to people about distracted driving following her near-fatal car accident after being struck by a 16-year old distracted driver in 2020 near Indian Creek Mall. In her interview with News Channel Nebraska in 2022, Casey said she wants people to take away from her presentation an important lesson: "I would say the number one take away is, there's nothing worth distracting your driving," Holsing said. "Focus on your road, focus on the driving, and the rest can wait. I shattered my shoulder, my humerus; I broke ribs, bruised my lung. Shattered my hips and pelvis. Shattered my L5, broke my femur, shattered my tib/fib, tore my bowel. So, lots of different injuries." Eleven surgeries and months of rehab later, Casey's ministry, if you will, is to preach this message to anyone with ears to hear.

## WORSHIP MATTERS



Why do we read scripture out loud in the service? St. Augustine's experience in the fourth century is still what we are after. He described his encounter with the heard word this way: "Thy Word struck my heart and I loved thee." To strike the heart of the hearer with

the power and peace of the word of God is the goal of the reading of scripture. Those well prepared for the task can approach with confidence the responsibility of being such instruments of the spirit of God. By God's grace, the reader has, in reality, the words of eternal life" on the tip of their tongue. Here are a few tips for the readers at Holy

Cross with gratitude for your ministry:

- Simply start with the reading. No greeting such as "good morning" is needed. Everything should focus the attention of the hearer on the word and not on the person reading the word.
- The first and second readings are announced: A reading from Isaiah or Romans, etc. No need to include chapter and verse.
- The Psalm is introduced: We read Psalm 23 responsively.
- Allow the words to sink in. Slow down. Pause at the periods. Take a breath at the semi-colons.
- Don't ignore the commas.
- No worries if you sneeze, cough or lose your place. Everyone knows you didn't want it to happen, so no apology is needed. Pause. Find your place. Continue.
- Read every word strong and sure! From the beginning to the end of the text.
- For help with pronouncing words, pick up a copy of A Handbook for Readers on the book shelf in the Conference Room and take it home it is yours. Or there is a copy available in the lectern. Or you can find resources online.
- Practice, practice, practice.
- When you have a reading from the book of Revelation it is often easy to add an "s" when there is none.

In a world that is shifting and changing, we have come to recognize the importance of asking good questions. #### **Questions to Consider:**

- What big questions are on your heart and mind?
- What is a question you are afraid to ask?
- What would you add to Martin Luther's 95 Theses?
- What is a 'GO to' question as you engage in conversation?

Prayer: Knowing God, what are you asking of me? Amen.

Song: "Ask the Complicated Questions" (ACS 1005)

- 1. Ask the complicated questions, do not fear to be found out; for our God makes strong our weakness, forging faith in fires of doubt.
- 2. Seek the disconcerting answers, follow where the Spirit blows; test competing truths for wisdom, for in tension new life grows.
- 3. Knock on doors of new ideas, test assumptions long grown stale; for Christ calls from shores of wonder, daring us to try and fail.
- 4. For in struggle we discover truth both simple and profound; in the knocking, asking, seeking, we are opened, answered, found.


events and Nadine & Larry for sponsoring Thrivent Action Teams.
