WORSHIP MATTERS



Remember the Newcomer (from Leading Worship Matters Augsburg Fortress, pg 260) "As you prepare for your role, whether you'll be greeting people before worship, serving communion, or leading the prayers, think about someone coming to Holy Cross for the first time. What would you like to offer that person through your presence in wor-

ship today? Can you give a sense of calm? A word of welcome? A smile? Remember that your presence reflects the welcome God has extended to us all."



Honesty requires vulnerability, awareness, and a willingness to really listen. Assumptions and half-truths can lead us to misunderstand the situation and story. What does reconciliation mean as we strive to move from places of misunderstanding? God calls us to be honest. Sometimes, that may look like lament and confession, and other times hymns of praise and gratitude.

Questions to Consider:

- What is a time you didn't tell the whole truth... or were not honest?
- What piece of history should you/could you explore with a lens of honesty?
- In what way are you being dishonest in your life?

GO and express gratitude by saying thank you to someone who deserves it.

Prayer: Reconciling God, we ask for forgiveness for the times we have not reconciled our differences and acknowledged the hurts and wounds we have caused. Amen.

CALLING ALL DRIVERS AND SOON-TO-BE- DRIVERS!

On Thankoffering Sunday, November 12, following worship. Casey Holsing will speak about "The Power of Prayer and Distracted Driving." Casey's mission in life is to talk to people about distracted driving following her near-fatal car accident after being struck by a 16-year old distracted driver in 2020 near Indian Creek Mall. In her interview with News Channel Nebraska in 2022, Casey said she wants people to take away from her presentation an important lesson: "I would say the number one take away is, there's nothing worth distracting your driving," Holsing said. "Focus on your road, focus on the driving, and the rest can wait. I shattered my shoulder, my humerus; I broke ribs, bruised my lung. Shattered my hips and pelvis. Shattered my L5, broke my femur, shattered my tib/fib, tore my bowel. So, lots of different injuries." Eleven surgeries and months of rehab later, Casey's ministry, if you will, is to preach this message to anyone with ears to hear.

LEAVES ARE A NUTRIENT-RICH COMPONENT OF YOUR

LANDSCAPE. Think about where they came from: the tree growing in your yard, using the nutrients from your soil! Returning them to that same soil so those nutrients can be recycled makes a lot of sense. This is done most easily by simply using a mulching mower to shred leaves that have landed on your turf (dry leaves shred more efficiently). Most Extension or turf resources say you can shred up to 6" of leaves into your turf, but smaller amounts at a time may be more efficient. If you

feel you have too many leaves to shred into the turf, composting at home is an option and a simple approach. The Internet is full of suggestions and helpful hints for being a successful home composter. Shredded leaves are a great starting material for creating 'black gold' that can be used just about anywhere in your garden or landscape.

Finally, in one of our newsletters earlier this fall, we talked about Soft Landings. Soft Landings is a concept that aims to provide a suitable environment under trees and shrubs that allows for insects - usually moths and butterflies - to overwinter and complete their life cycles. Shredded leaves work perfect for this. Collect the leaves with the bag of your mower as you remove them from your turf areas. Alternatively, many leaf blowers have a reverse function, effectively turning your leaf blower into a combo leaf vacuum and shredder. These shredded leaves can be applied as mulch underneath trees and shrubs and in other planting beds, using the same principles as those for the application of hardwood mulch - not too thick (about 2-3") and not up against the trunk and bark. They will provide similar moisture retention and weed suppression capabilities as hardwood mulch and perhaps be a bit more inviting to those creatures looking for a long winter's nap.
